Consider Saul, for as the king of God's people, he began his reign in honour of the Lord, and laboured to lead the Israelites to do what is pleasing to their God. The young king was at work building God's kingdom, for "Saul", we are told, "built an altar to the Lord". But not long 🕂 after, Saul began to lose sight of God, looking inwards he finds another idol worthy of adoration and "sets up a monument for himself".
